Den meeting frequency depends on the Cub Scout's grade level and the Pack.

The Cub Scout (CS) Program runs during the school year, August through May. Some Packs will continue to have summer events.

Each Den/Rank is a specific grade level with age-appropriate activities:

- Lions are in Kindergarten
- Tigers are in 1st Grade
- Wolves are in 2nd Grade
- Bears are in 3rd Grade
- Webelos are in 4th Grade
- Arrow of Light (AOL) are in 5th Grade

A Cub Scout earns their rank badge, when they complete 8 "Adventures". Six are required and two are selected from the list of electives.

Lions wear the official Lion t-shirt. Cub Scouts wear the official blue uniform shirt. AOL scouts transition to the official tan uniform shirt.

We recommend buying a size larger than needed, so your scout can grow into the uniform.

Cub Scout Program Organizational Overview

Den Leaders – An adult, usually a parent, serves as a Den Leader. They carry out the activities related to "Adventures" as they are presented in the Cub Scout's handbook and the Den Leader Guide.

Dens – A small group of Cub Scouts who are the same gender and in the same grade. The ideal size is 6 to 8 Cub Scouts.

Den Chief
A Scout from a Troop that assists the Cub Scout Den and serves as a role model.

Cubmaster – The leader of the pack meeting is the Cubmaster. In addition to serving as the master of ceremonies, the Cubmaster provides support to Den Leaders.

Pack – The pack is made up of several dens. The make up and size of the pack varies based on local interest and resources. Each pack is identified by a number and sometimes is referred to as a unit.

Pack Committee – Made up of parents, leaders, and other caring adults the pack. The pack committees referred to as a unit.

Each Pack has its own unique style and personality. They usually meet once a month. Pack Committee consists of at least three members – chair, secretary and treasurer.

Pack Committee Chair (CC) – Top volunteer in the pack. Responsible for ensuring enough qualified adult volunteers are in place to provide the program and leads the pack committee meetings.

Chartered Organization Representative (COR) – This person appoints the Pack Committee Chair and approves all adult leaders. They provide resources from the chartered organization.

Chartered Organization – This is the organization that partners with the Scouting America (previously known as BSA) to deliver a Scouting program. They adopt Scouting to serve the youth in the community.

Grand Canyon Council (GCC) #10 – To effectively support local Scouting programs the national Scouting America organization (previously known as Boy Scouts of America), provides a charter to a community board of volunteers to be responsible for providing the Scouting program to a defined geographical area. These geographical areas are called councils. Councils have a volunteer board which employs a Scout Executive to serve as the CEO and give leadership to the day-to-day operation. The Scout Executive hires staff to provide direct and indirect support to local Scouting programs. In each council there are many more volunteers than staff as the organization is volunteer lead and professionally guided.

Unit Coach (Volunteers) Coaches are volunteers who are assigned to a geographic area and available to guide Packs.	Field Executives (Staff) They are assigned to a geographic area and assist Packs and also help with fundraising with camp cards and popcorn.	Program Services (Staff) The team works with volunteers coordinating council events for the youth (Packs & Troops).	Customer Service (Staff) Staff at the Grand Canyon Office are always available to assist Packs or connect them with the correct staff.
